MANUEL ÁLVAREZ BRAVO: EVERYDAY THEATRE 24 MAR – 22 MAY 2022

Everyday Theatre is a new exhibition of rare lifetime prints from **Manuel Álvarez Bravo** (1902 - 2002) – a master of modernism and one of the most important figures in 20th century Latin American photography.

Born and raised in Mexico City, Álvarez Bravo's career as a photographer spanned the greater part of the 20th century, and his distinctive images both illustrate and embody Mexico's changing social and cultural landscape over this period.

Largely self-taught, he began experimenting with the medium in his teenage years, at the tail-end of the Mexican Revolution – an event that inevitably affected his approach to image-making. Although his early work reflects the influence of European artistic movements, his subject matter is rooted in his immediate landscape and those who inhabited it, and he soon became entranced by the Mexican muralism movement and the general cultural and political push to redefine Mexican identity. Álvarez Bravo was part of an international circle of avant-garde artists including photographers Tina Modotti, Edward Weston and fellow Mexican artists, Diego Rivera and Frida Kahlo, many of whom appear in his images, and whose practices and ideas helped refine his own creative identity.

He was highly adept technically, favouring the complex platinum printing process (first introduced to him by Modotti in 1928) which allowed him to find exactly the right tonalities for his work and showcased his immense skills in the darkroom. Although he had to abandon this process for a large part of his career, due to difficulty obtaining the right materials, he was able to come back to the technique in the 1970s and remained committed to it for the rest of his life.

Whether motivated by ideas of modernism, social documentary, surrealist experimentation, or compositional arrangements, Álvarez Bravo's work is deeply rooted in indigenous Mexican culture. Resolute in his rejection of both the picturesque and stereotyping, his intention as a photographer was in capturing and elevating the scenes he witnessed around him. His quietly poetic, rhythmic compositions turned the ordinary into the noteworthy, the prosaic into theatre.

This special exhibition celebrates Álvarez Bravo's distinctive eye and place in 20th century Mexico, and marks his long-standing relationship with The Photographers' Gallery.
