Sebastião Ribeiro Salgado Júnior (b. 1944, Brazil) is regarded as one of the world's most celebrated and foremost social documentary photographers.

He began photographing in the 1970s. and quickly established a name for himself due to his highly politicised, often epic in scale, powerful black and white images. He predominantly works in series form, returning to themes and locations and documenting dramatic landscapes, marginalised people, and endangered species as a way of highlighting social injustice and environmental concerns.

This special presentation of collectors' prints, curated by TPG's Print Sales team, showcases a selection of Salgado's most iconic and career-defining images from projects such as *Genesis*, *Migrations*, *Serra Pelada*, *Kuwait*, and *Amazônia and* offers a rare chance to view and purchase work from this extraordinary photographer.

This exhibition coincides with Salgado's major new touring exhibition, *Amazônia*, which opens at the Science Museum, London on 13 October 2021.

The Photographers' Gallery (TPG) was founded in London's Covent Garden in 1971 as the first public gallery in the UK dedicated to the photographic medium. From the outset, the sale of prints from new and established international photographers – however informally - was an important part of the Gallery's offer, not least as a way of extending its support for photographers. In 1981 as both interest and demand for photography grew, the Gallery established a small but dedicated area for the exploration and sales of fine-art prints. Over the years this initial outlet has grown in scale and ambition, to become firmly established, as the Print Sales Gallery – TPG's specialist centre for anyone interested in discovering, learning about and acquiring high-quality, hand-picked work from an exciting roster of photographers.

Particularly renown for showcasing and supporting young emerging talent, Print Sales Gallery are proud to have played a significant part in launching the careers of Simon Roberts, Idris Khan, Simon Norfolk, and Julie Cockburn amongst many others. It continues to cultivate and showcase exciting new talents, such as Evgenia Arbugaeva and Vasantha Yogananthan.

All profits from Print Sales support TPG's public programme - allowing us to support younger emerging artists at crucial stages of their careers.

Cromwell Place

Cromwell Place is a Membership organisation offering a first-of-its-kind exhibition and working space in central London, located in the heart of South Kensington's museum district and housed within five Grade II listed buildings. Designed in 1858 by Sir Charles James Freake, the Victorian townhouses house 15 unique gallery spaces, events, permanent and shared offices, hot-desks, meeting rooms and viewing rooms, and a Members-only Club Room. Cromwell Place is home to some of the world's most exciting galleries, collectors, dealers and advisors: with specialties ranging from Antiquities and Old Masters through to the 19th Century. Open to the public from Wednesday through Saturday 10am – 6pm, and 10am – 4pm on Sundays. Tuesdays are reserved for invitation-only visits. Find out more here.

The Photographers' Gallery

The Photographers' Gallery opened in 1971 in Great Newport Street, London, as the UK's first independent gallery devoted to photography. It was the first public gallery in the UK to exhibit many key names in international photography, including Juergen Teller, Robert Capa, Sebastiano Salgado and Andreas Gursky. The Gallery has also been instrumental in establishing contemporary British photographers, including Martin Parr and Corinne Day. In 2009, the Gallery moved to 16 - 18 Ramillies Street in Soho, the first stage in its plan to create a 21^{st} century home for photography. Following an eighteen months long redevelopment project, the Gallery reopened to the public in 2012. The success of The Photographers' Gallery over the past four decades has helped to establish photography as a recognised art form, introducing new audiences to photography and championing its place at the heart of visual culture. www.thephotographersgallery.org.uk
